

Advertisement for Joint Editor of *European Journal of Education*

The European Institute of Education and Social Policy (EIESP) and Wiley invite individuals to apply for the position of Joint Editor for *European Journal of Education (EJE)* to join Janet Looney in leading the editorial team of *EJE* from April 2022.

The *European Journal of Education* is an international, peer reviewed journal that presents high quality, recent research and policy analysis with a primary focus on Europe, placed in an international perspective. The Journal publishes the results of European research projects and explores key topics of concern to policy makers and international organizations in Europe and further afield. It is the only European journal publishing about education matters that covers a broad spectrum in education, aiming to build bridges between research and policy and to address issues of concern to the different levels and types of education, transversal topics and 'big issues' for policy agendas. This includes an active and on-going discussion of European education policies. The Journal welcomes cross-disciplinary approaches within the education sector and with other sectors.

The *European Journal of Education* has a strong special issues program, publishing thematic issues which present a range of perspectives and research on a topic and the key issues for future research and policy.

The new Joint Editor will work in close collaboration with the editorial team consisting of fellow Joint Editor Janet Looney, Director of the EIESP, outgoing Editor Richard Desjardins from the School of Education and Information Studies, UCLA, and Associate Editor Susan Wiksten from the EIESP, as well as the Publisher. The appointment is for a 3-year term.

The successful candidate for the position of Joint Editor will be recognized internationally for their achievements in this area and have a good track record of their own publications and presentations at conferences. They will also have an extensive international network of contacts whom they would be willing to invite to contribute to *EJE*.

The ideal candidate will possess the following skills and knowledge:

- Broad knowledge of comparative European educational research, practice and policies.
- Good understanding of the profile and nature of the *European Journal of Education*.
- Sound judgment about the conduct of diverse forms of research.
- Knowledge of the current and forthcoming changes in the publishing landscape.
- Strong communication skills and ability to work as part of a team.
