

Advertisement for Editor-in-Chief of the *European Law Journal*

The *European Law Journal* (ELJ) is seeking to appoint a new Editor(s)-in-Chief to take effect in 2020.

The ELJ is a leading, internationally reputed, peer-reviewed journal in the field of European law. It has been a pioneer in the study of European law in its social, economic, political, and cultural context. It is published six times a year by Wiley. The ELJ is essential reading for anyone studying or practising EU law and its diverse impact on the environment, national legal systems, local government, economic organisations and European citizens. The ELJ is published in English. It regularly publishes articles from many countries and welcomes submissions in all languages. The new Editor-in-Chief will be responsible from April 2020 for the editorship of the journal for a term of 3+ years. Throughout the editorial term, the successful candidate or team will have the responsibility for appointing an editorial board, setting editorial policy and procedure, and working closely with Wiley to develop the future strategy of the journal.

Criteria for the candidate:

- Outstanding scholarship in European legal studies with the ability to develop further the international standing of the journal.
- Proven commitment to the journal's distinctive interdisciplinary law approach.
- Appreciation of the intellectual and cultural diversity of the field of European legal studies.
- Excellent organisational skills.

Previous editorial experience is an advantage. The Publisher will provide the services of a full-time managing editor to assist in running the journal's online submission and peer review system, reporting on submission statistics, and the management of papers through the production and publication process.

Applicants need to show that they have the support of their academic institution. Joint appointments and editorial team applications are welcome.

Editorial expenses will be discussed at the interview.
