

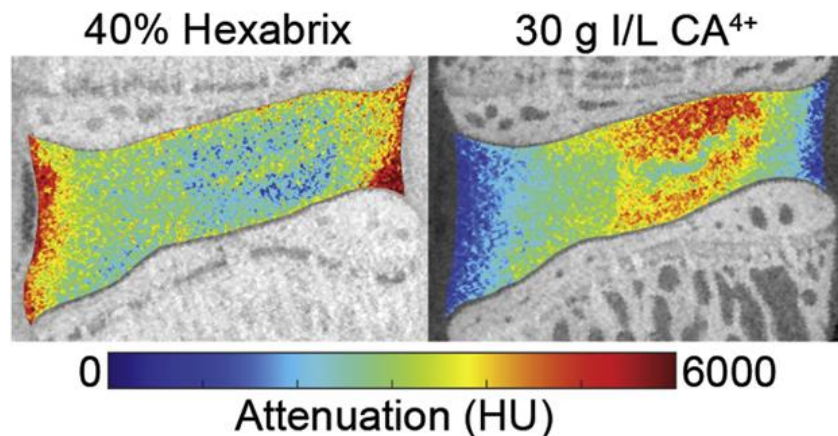
Introducing Graphical Abstracts

The *Journal of Orthopaedic Research* is excited to offer Graphical Abstracts to interested authors wishing to introduce and expand on their research in a more visual and dynamic way!

Please see below for instructions on how to submit a graphical abstract with your manuscript and refer to the following examples of recently published graphical abstracts.

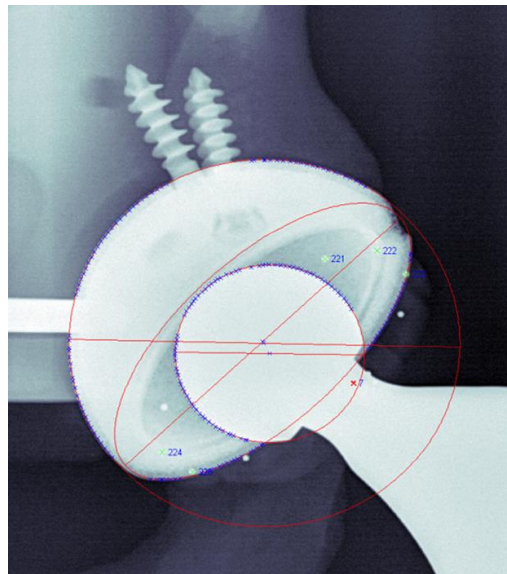
- Prepare a .doc file which includes:
 - the article title;
 - the authors' names (corresponding author indicated by an asterisk); and
 - 80-words abstract summarizing the key findings presented in the paper.
- Submit a figure that:
 - best represents the scope of the paper;
 - is in tiff, eps, jpeg, file formats;
 - is within the dimensions of 50mm x 60mm; and
 - has a minimum resolution of 300 dpi.
- Avoid graphs and other figures with fine detail due to the relatively small size of this image.
- Entitle the .doc file and figure file 'Graphical Abstract' and upload to ScholarOne Manuscript (S1M) during the manuscript submission process.

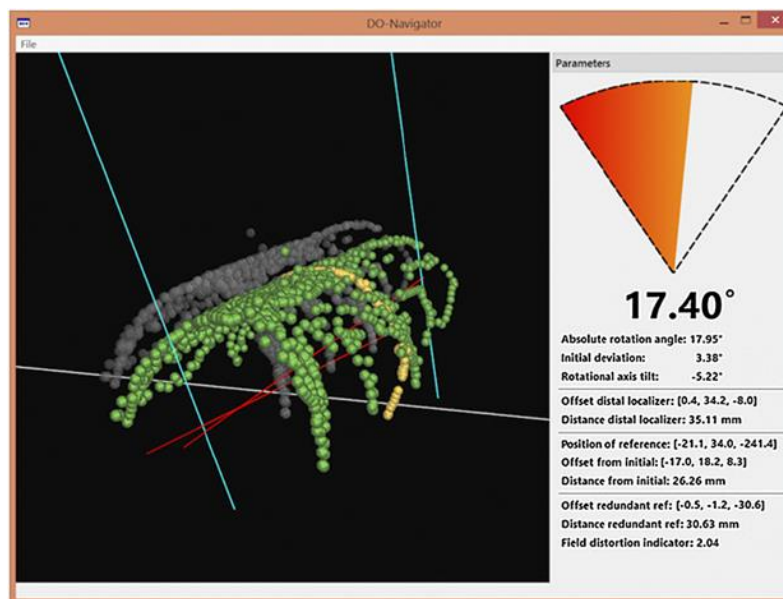
