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1. GENERAL

Laser & Photonics Reviews is a journal that covers articles in the field of laser, photonics and optical sciences.

The main focus is set on the publication of review articles but short letter articles, original papers, etc. of high quality are published as well. To ensure the continued high quality of the journal, only a very limited amount of letter articles, original papers, etc. are considered. The selection is done by a strict peer-review procedure with editorial pre-screening.

Only original papers that have not been published elsewhere or have been submitted simultaneously to another journal will be considered.

Language of publication is English.

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Review Articles: The size of a review article may differ, a length of about 80,000 characters (with spaces) or 12,000 words incl. references, excl. figures is recommended. Depending on the number of figures, this corresponds to about 15–25 print pages. A passport-type photo and a short CV (max. 500 characters) should be included.

Letters must be complete, self-contained short papers, of high relevance and urgency. Letters will be given preference in speed of publication. The size of a letter is restricted to 3–4 print pages. This corresponds to an estimated length of about 15,000 characters (with spaces) or 2,300 words plus 1–3 figures and a short reference list.

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Please indicate the article type in your cover letter. A photo and a short summary that highlights the career to-date of the corresponding author(s) and their (current) research interests should also be included.

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Authors may also submit supplementary material, for example videos or animations. The author bears full responsibility for the content of the supplementary material. Color and animated multimedia applications are welcome and published online at no cost to the author or reader. In general, the contents of the Supporting Information should be mentioned shortly in the article, e.g. as a footnote. Supplementary material is published online open and is directly linked to the main article on Wiley Online Library.

In case of extra text, figures or tables please make sure to mention "Supporting Information, title of main

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The manuscript should contain the following elements:

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- Full address, including email, telephone and fax, of the corresponding author
- Abstract (up to 200 words); written in impersonal style, active “we” form should be avoided
- Eye-catching abstract figure
- Short title inclusive author names (A. Firstauthor-name, B. Secondauthorname, and C. Thirdauthor-name: Short title)
- Key words (at least four, up to eight key words)
- Main text
- List of references (complete author list, numbered in the order of appearance in the text)
- Figures and figure captions
- **for Review Articles, Progress Reports and Expert Opinions only:** A photo and a short CV (max. 500 characters) that highlights the career to-date of the corresponding author(s) and their (current) research interests should be included. Awards, number of publications, number of patents, etc. should not be included in the biography.
- **Graphical Abstract:** It should be a short descriptive and popular text on the general aim and value of your paper (up to 70 words, not a figure caption, not the ab-

stract text) and should be written in impersonal or passive style. Please also suggest an image (full color, size: ideally 5 x 5 cm). It can be one from your article or may be specifically designed for the purpose.

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Equations may be numbered sequentially. Except for small in-line equations, they should appear on separate lines. Please provide equations in an editable format, like Mathtype. Do not embed equations as graphics.

In the text, equations may be referred to by writing "... in Eq. (1)". At the beginning of a sentence, use the full form "Equation (1) shows ...".

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In the text, the figures or tables are referred to as "... in Fig./Table 1" or as "Figure/Table 1 shows ...".

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References should be numbered (in square brackets, such as [1, 2] or [1-3] and listed in the order of citations in the text at the end of the manuscript. Please apply the format used in *Laser & Photonics Reviews* for journal article and book citations.
