Call for Papers on Climate Change and Health

Many effects of climate change are already evident globally, with grave implications for human health, and conditions expected to become more acute over time. Health impacts occur in cascading and overlapping categories, including infectious disease, disaster preparedness, migration, nutrition, and mental health, to name just a few, with disparate outcomes experienced among already marginalized groups. Policymakers, public health and medical professionals, and related communities of researchers and scholars, can contribute to advancing understanding of present and anticipated health threats, and mitigating adverse consequences of climate change on health.
